New Braunfels Utilities' Offices to be Closed In Observance of Founder's Day, April 19, 2019

(New Braunfels, TX – April 2, 2019) – The New Braunfels Utilities (NBU) offices will be closed on Friday, April 19, 2019 in observance of Founder's Day. Led by Prince Carl, German immigrants crossed the Guadalupe River near the site of the Faust Street Bridge on March 21, 1845, which happened to be Good Friday that year.

Customers needing to report an outage or service issue are asked to call NBU's 24-hour Control Center at 830.629.4628 (4NBU). The Texting Outage Notification System is an added convenience that allows customers who are enrolled in the program to report outages and receive notifications on outages in their area by text message.
