New Braunfels Utilities Announces Long-Term Road Closure to Continue Wastewater Infrastructure Project

(New Braunfels, TX – July 12, 2019) – New Braunfels Utilities announces long-term lane and road closures of Ewelling and Sleepy Hollow Lanes beginning Monday, July 15, through Monday, September 30, 2019. Crews will be installing infrastructure that includes laying a 30-inch wastewater main along Ewelling Lane and Sleepy Hollow Lane in preparation for the Gruene Water Reclamation Facility (GWRP).

The Gruene Water Reclamation Facility, currently under construction, is scheduled for completion in 2020. Once completed, the GWRP will have the treatment capacity of up to 2.5 Million Gallons per Day and the current Gruene Wastewater Treatment Plant will be decommissioned.

Detours and traffic controls signs will be in place to safely guide traffic through the area. The closure is necessary in order to maneuver equipment, materials, and crews safely. For additional information, please call 830.608.8971.

Work is expected to be completed in the timeframe noted, pending weather and other factors.
