



Know Your Water Stages







New Braunfels Utilities monitors the Edwards Aguifer level and implements water restrictions to encourage conservation and protect natural resources in times of drought. Drought status is publicly communicated through a series of numbered stages, each with unique water use guidelines. Our service territory is currently in Stage 3 water restrictions.

Conservation Corner



SPRING CONSERVATION TIPS



- With spring fast approaching and grass coming out of dormancy, it is important to remember that lawns only need one inch of water a week.
- While the NBU service territory remains in Stage 3 drought restrictions, landscape watering with an irrigation system or sprinkler is allowed every other week on your designated day. During non-watering weeks, watering with a hand-held hose, bucket, drip irrigation, or soaker hose that does not spray in the air is allowed any day, but only before 10:00 a.m. or after 8:00 p.m. This practice helps us protect our natural resources during periods of drought.
- It's important to check sprinkler systems and timing devices regularly to be sure they are operating properly. This helps ensure that sprinkler heads are watering grass and shrubs and not paved areas, which may result in water waste.
- When setting control timers, it is recommended that each zone be programmed between 5 and 10 minutes each. This will help you avoid any water waste into the street.
- When setting your controller, make sure you not only set it at designated watering times, but also before the sun rises or after it sets to avoid evaporation. Also, make sure your rain sensor is switched to "active" to conserve water during heavy rainfall.
