This letter contains important information about compliance requirements for your public water system.

Attention: Public Water System Owner / Manager / Operator

The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) has determined that **NEW BRAUNFELS UTILITIES** has a monitoring and reporting (M/R) violation for failing to monitor source and finished water or failing to submit a Monthly Total Organic Carbon Removal Report (TOCMOR) for the following compliance period, **3rd Quarter 2024**, as described in Title 30, Texas Administrative Code (30 TAC), §290.112. The attached Violation Report summarizes each violation by monitoring period and rule.

In accordance with Title 30, Texas Administrative Code (30 TAC) §290.122(c), your public water system is required to issue public notification to your customers about the monitoring/reporting violation(s) as soon as possible, but not later than twelve months after the date the violation(s) was identified. The public notice must use the enclosed mandatory language for every notice, and include a brief statement about what you plan to do to fix the problem as described in 30 TAC §290.122(d). This statement must describe what actions the water system is taking to correct the violation, and when the water system expects to return to compliance.

The TCEQ recommends that the public water system provide a copy of the Public Notice(s) or Notice of Enforcement to local and state officials, such as Mayors, City Council Members, County Commissioners, Judges, and/or State Representatives, that are located in or that represent the affected area(s) served by the system.

You are required to repeat the notice every twelve months for as long as the violation persists. You should use the same method that you used for the initial notice. Please send a copy of the public notification and a signed Certificate of Delivery for Public Notice to this office within 10 days after it has been delivered. Mail to:

All community and non-transient non-community public water systems that use a series of treatment processes including coagulation, flocculation, sedimentation or clarification, and filtration as part of the overall treatment protocol must monitor total organic carbon and report the results of that monitoring on the Monthly Total Organic Carbon Removal Report (TOCMOR). The TOCMOR is found within the Surface Water Monthly Operating Report. Please ensure you are using the most updated version of the SWMOR form for your system.
